We would like to inform you of Kane School District's responsibilities regarding our relationship with home educators. The District's Policy #FBB – Compulsory Education/Home School, in conformance with state law, provides, in part, as follows:

It is the intent of the Board of Education of Kane School District to fully comply with the compulsory education requirements of Utah state law. The Board recognizes the rights of parents/legal guardians to enroll their children in educational programs other than public schools, so long as those alternative educational programs meet the requirements of applicable state law.

Under Utah law, a parent/guardian of a minor student who attends a home school is **solely** responsible for the education of that school age minor, including materials, time, place and method of instruction. However, before that responsibility shifts to the parent/guardian, the Board of Education must excuse the student from the state's compulsory attendance requirements, and the parent/guardian will receive a copy of the Exemption Certificate from District administration.

As required by law, parents/guardians who wish to home school their minor student must file with the District a signed and notarized Affidavit stating that the minor student will attend a home school. (<u>Utah Code Ann.</u>, Section 53G-6-204).

After the Affidavit is received, the Board will consider it at the next regularly scheduled Board meeting. The District will issue the parent/guardian an Exemption Certificate, excusing the school-aged minor from compulsory attendance. The District will issue a new Exemption Certificate each year thereafter on or before August 1 unless and until one of the following occurs: 1) the school-age minor enrolls in a school within the District, 2) the parent or guardian notifies the District that the school district of residence has changed, or 3) the parent or guardian notifies the District that the school-age minor no longer attends home school. The Exemption Certificate will be on file at the District Office, and the parent/guardian may request a copy after August 31 of each year.

Please keep in mind that the Exemption Certificate must be received by the parent/guardian before a student may be withdrawn from public school to be educated in a home school. Once the Exemption Certificate is received, you may proceed with proper checkout procedures at the student's school to officially unenroll the student from all or part of their classes. Students should continue to attend their assigned school until issuance of the Exemption Certificate and completion of the checkout procedures to avoid unexcused absences and possible truancy proceedings.

The School District recognizes that parents/guardians are ultimately responsible for their children's educational program. To help parents with their home school efforts, the District offers the following services upon request:

1. Home school students may be assigned to the public school they could attend, and parents may be provided, upon request and availability, with textbooks and other materials similar to what other students receive. There may be fees required for some of these textbooks and materials.

- 2. Home school parents/guardians have the opportunity to consult with the principals and teachers, in a reasonable and appropriate manner, to help in the education of their children.
- 3. Home school students with disabilities may be eligible for Special Education services, such as psychological evaluations, speech and hearing services, and other related services available under applicable federal and state laws and regulations.
- 4. At the request of a parent/guardian to the school principal, home school students may be allowed to participate in normally administered school assessments (i.e., RISE, ACT, Special Education Assessment, etc.).
- 5. Upon the request of a parent, the District shall identify the knowledge, skills, and competencies a student is recommended to attain by grade level and subject area to assist the parent in achieving college and career readiness through home schooling (Utah Code Ann. §53G-6-204).
