
Congratulate Class of 2017

According to a report published in 2016 by the U.S. Bureau of Labor and Statistics, adults who do not receive a high school diploma have a 7.4% unemployment rate and earn a median annual income of \$26,208. Comparatively, a high school graduate experiences a 5.2% unemployment rate and a median income of \$36,036. Please see the graph below:
