High School Feedback Report

Kane County School District recently received the 2015 Utah System of Higher Education, High School Feedback Report. The purpose of the High School Feedback report is to track students who are making the transition from high school to college. This report shows the college performance of the 2014-2015 high school graduating class who enrolled in a public college or university in Utah. The report shows that students from Kane District who entered college scored substantially higher than the state average in Math 1010, 1030, 1040 or 1050, and Intro to Writing. In the college math courses, 100% of the students who enrolled in these courses passed with a "C" or higher. Additionally, Kane students had a higher than average ACT composite score of 23 compared to 22 in the state of Utah. Simply put, students who graduated from Kane District are more successful in their first year of college than other students across the state. I know this type of student success does not come by chance, and is the direct result of committed faculty, staff, parents, and communities who dedicate time to educate students in our district.
