Concurrent Enrollment Fall 2019

Concurrent Enrollment means a high school student is enrolled in a course that satisfies both high school graduation requirements and also qualifies for college credit, which is governed by Utah State Board Rule <u>R277-713-2</u>. Students can enroll in concurrent enrollment courses in the 11th and 12th grades, and with special permission in the 9th or 10th grades. High school students can earn college credit at a substantially reduced cost of \$5.00 per credit compared to over \$200 per credit for adults. Kanab and Valley high schools will be holding parent information nights in February to answer questions and register students for college enrollment. In March, Snow College will begin their early registration for fall classes for students in rural school districts, but the classes quickly reach their maximum enrollment numbers and as such, our students will need to have their university student numbers to enroll in their classes before the registration opens. Students can earn their associates degree while they are in high school and qualify for the <u>Regents Scholarship</u>, which will pay for their next two years of college. If your student needs help registering or creating their student registration number, they can contact the high school counselors. Please don't wait until the college registration date opens, as it may be too late for students to enroll.
