

Kane District ACT 2018 Summary Report

Kane School District recently received the ACT Profile Summary Report for the 11th grade students who participated in the national assessment last February. We are pleased to report our students received higher composite score averages and outperformed other students across the state in all English, Science and Math categories. Additionally, Kane School District students earned higher averages on the optional writing test assessment when compared to other 11th grade students across the state. Higher ACT scores allow for students to receive additional college scholarships and helps them to be awarded university index funding, which is calculated based on the student's GPA and ACT composite scores. Kane students also outpaced the state averages in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) benchmarks over the last two years. The following are graphs from the ACT Profile Summary report comparing the Kane District to the state averages on the ACT assessment. We would like to congratulate the class of 2019 on the outstanding scores on the ACT. Figure 1.1. Average Composite Scores: 5 Years of Testing*

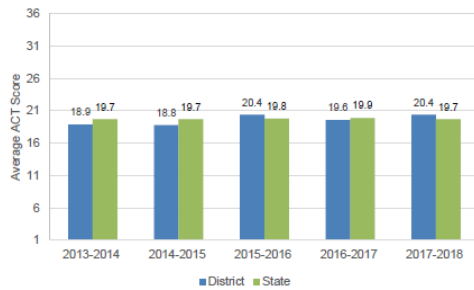


Figure 2.3. Math Reporting Categories¹

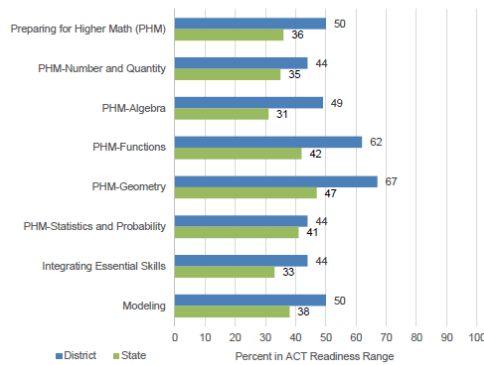


Figure 2.5. Science Reporting Categories¹

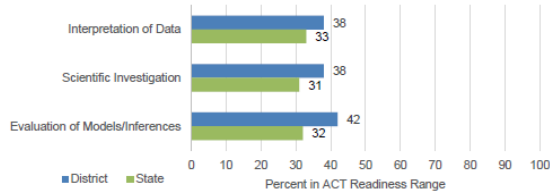
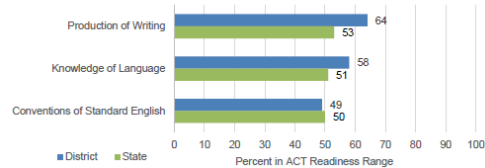


Figure 2.2. English Reporting Categories¹
