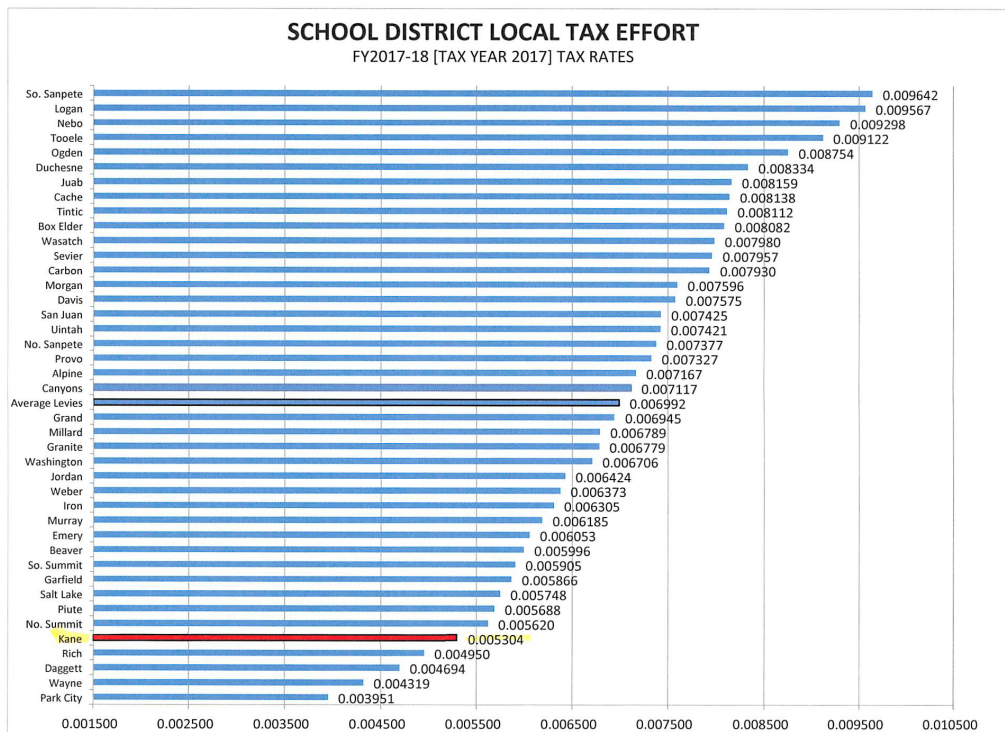


School District Local Tax Effort

Utah statutes require all school districts to close out the current fiscal year and adopt a new budget for the upcoming school year. As part of the budgeting process, local school boards must approve the local tax levies that will be collected by the county and distributed to districts. The most recent tax information available is from the FY2017-2018 school year, which shows that South Sanpete assesses the highest school tax rate of .009642, and the state average is .006992. Kane School District's new budget for FY 2018-2019 did **not** include a tax increase and will remain at .00534, which is the fifth lowest tax assessment in the state. Even with the low tax assessment, the Kane District spends approximately \$12,656 per student, which is the third highest student expenditure in the state. I have included the school district local tax effort by district for your reference. I appreciate the opportunity work for a district that collects one of the lowest tax rates and provides a high quality education with the needed resources to our students.
