

Concurrent Enrollment Parent Night

Our local high schools will be hosting a parent night to discuss concurrent enrollment programs. Concurrent enrollment classes allow students to take college courses while enrolled in high school at the very reduced rate of approximately \$15 per course. If a student enrolled in these same courses as an adult, the cost would exceed \$600 for the same course. If students want to take advantage of the concurrent enrollment classes offered in our schools, they could earn an associate degree for approximately \$300. If a student completes their associate degree prior to graduating high school they are eligible for the new Century Scholarship, which can pay for their remaining two years of college, allowing them to earn their the bachelor degree at little or no cost. Concurrent enrollment courses allow students the opportunity to earn college and high school credit at the same time. Some 10th grade students and all 11th and 12th grade students have the opportunity to enroll in concurrent enrollment courses once they are accepted into the universities. Valley High School will hold their concurrent enrollment parent meeting on March 29th at 6:00 pm at VHS. Kanab High School will hold their concurrent enrollment meeting for parents on March 16th at 6:00 pm in the new music room. The first date to enroll student for the fall semester opens on March 20th. Please arrange your schedule to allow you and your student to attend the concurrent enrollment meeting in your local high school. Attendance to the meeting may be the pathway to students earning a college bachelor degree! We hope to see you there.
