Concurrent Enrollment Parent Meeting

Concurrent enrollment means a public high school student is enrolled in a course that satisfies both high school graduation requirements and qualifies for higher education credit from a Utah System of Higher Education (USHE). Essentially, concurrent enrollment allows a high school student to take college classes that count toward both high school and college credits. High school students only pay \$5.00 per college credit but the classes fill up quickly, so early registration is critical for students who are interested in concurrent enrollment courses. To help students and parents with the concurrent enrollment process, Kanab High School will hold a parent meeting on March 19th at 6:00 pm in the KHS library. Valley High will hold a parent concurrent enrollment meeting on March 20th from 4:00 pm to 6:00 pm in the VHS little theater. March 25th with be the first day of concurrent enrollment registration for the fall 2019 semester. In the 2019 Legislative session, HB 146 was passed, which now allows 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th grade students to participate in concurrent enrollment courses. If you or your child is interested in concurrent enrollment classes, please plan to attend the scheduled parent meeting at your school. If you are unable to attend one of the concurrent enrollment meetings, please schedule a meeting with your high school counselor.
