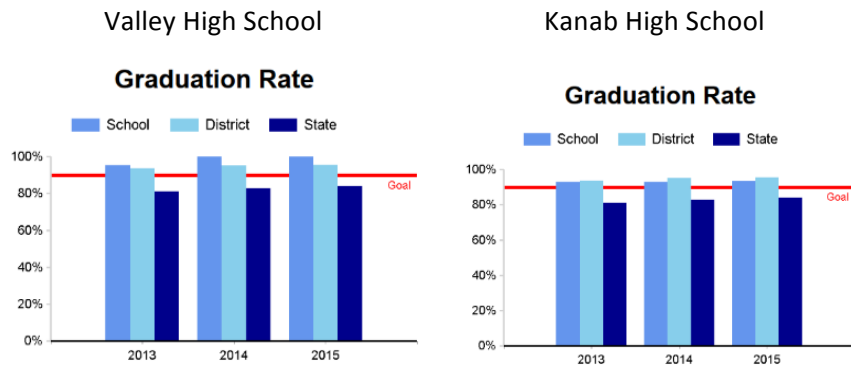


Recently a federal accountability report released statistics showing that the nation’s high school graduation rate increased again during the 2014-2015 school year. The increase in graduation rates showed gains in every group of students including white, black, Asian, Hispanic, Native American, as well as students with disabilities, English as second language, and low-income students. The national graduation rate rose to 83 percent of students earning a diploma. In Kane School District, both Valley and Kanab high schools have well over a 90% graduation rate. The historical graduation percentages over the past three years for both high schools is as follows:
