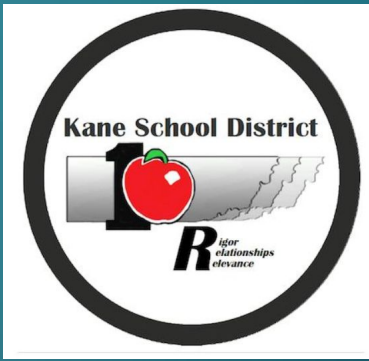

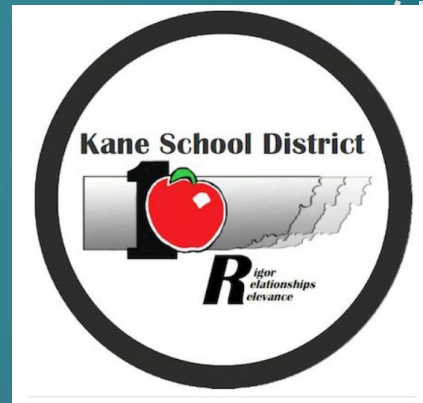

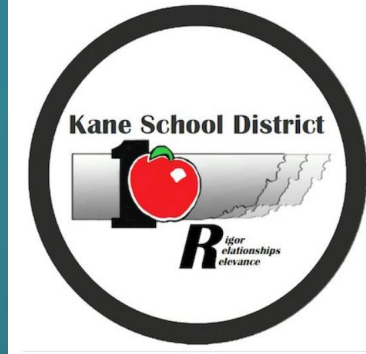
# GOVERNOR'S PRESS CONFERENCE



## Governor Herbert COVID 19 Task Force Recommendations

- Limit mass gatherings of more than 100 people
- Over the age of 60 and have health risks - limit participation to groups of 20 or less
- Implement teleworking ASAP
- Long-term care restricted screening access
- ALL higher education are going digital
- K-12 schools are being asked to prepare for closures...plan in pace "Ready, Set, Go"

- At 4:00 pm State Health Department made the following announcement:
- “Dismissal” for all schools and school related activities. Preventative Measure
- Statewide school “dismissal” allows for teachers to work in the building, a few students to come into the building (by appointment only), grab and go lunches available (location TBA). “Closure” stops everyone from coming to the school.
- Looking at a two week timeline for now and then they will be reevaluated. USBE waivers will be discussed in their upcoming board meeting (180 day).
- School days must provide educational instruction. R277-419 ( teachers need to keep track of the student instruction they are providing). USBE may allow (2) days for digital preparation (possibly count as part of 180).
- Staggered schedules to send Chromebooks home to increase social distance.
- Additional press release coming to LEAs.

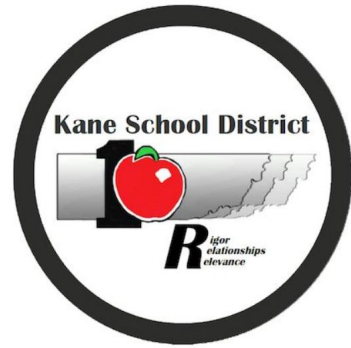
MIDVALE, Utah (March 12, 2020) - The Utah High School Activities Association is announcing the suspension of the Association's State Debate Championships scheduled for this weekend due to ongoing prevention efforts with the COVID-19 virus.

The Association is also suspending all UHSAA spring activities beginning Monday, March 16, for a period of at least two weeks. Member schools and/or districts as a local decision may suspend spring activities immediately. Those member schools and/or districts will need to work with the UHSAA on suspensions. All out of state school related travel has been suspended immediately for a period of at least two weeks.

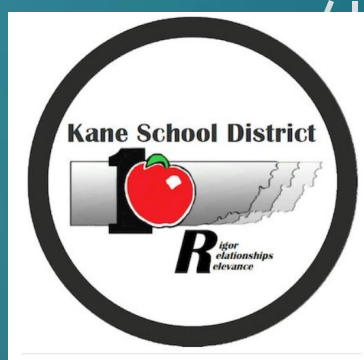

## Digital Instruction

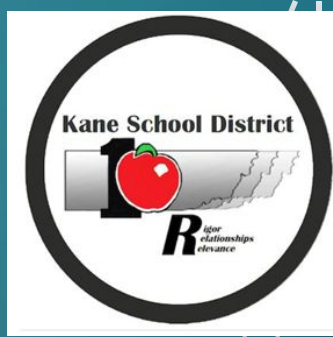

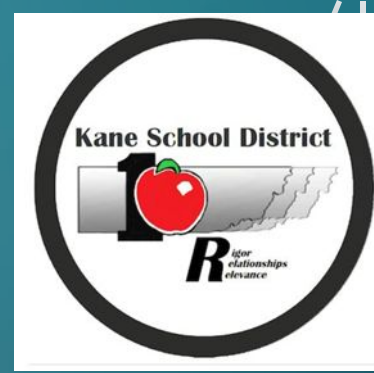

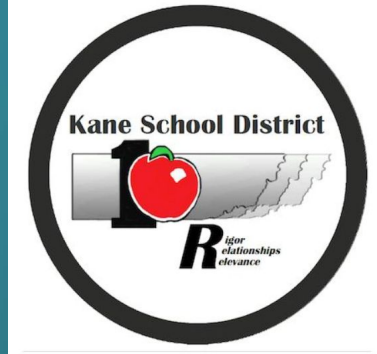

# IN SUMMARY

- Starting Monday March 16<sup>th</sup> school “closure” statewide
- Teachers will use Monday March 16<sup>th</sup> as preparation day to prepare for online instruction. If you are ready to begin instruction, you do not need to come to school (teachers and aides, please be in communication with your principal). Lunch workers will plan how, when and where to distribute school lunches
- March 17<sup>th</sup> teachers will begin to deliver digital instruction from home or their classrooms. Teachers may want to create office hours for small groups to come by appointment
- For now we will continue with the ACT in multiple classrooms on March 24<sup>th</sup> with 6 ft spacing between students.
- With online instruction occurring, funding will continue to flow to the districts from the USBE so certified and classified employees will continue to get paid.
